Primary pupils honoured the occasion too by making their very own poppy wreaths.



Magna

Our primary pupils went to Magna, an interactive science museum. They did a workshop all about solids, liquids and gases - one of the experiments was so large that it hit the roof! They explored each of the 4 elements: earth, air, water and fire. The fire tornado was their favourite part, but the pupils also loved making clouds, learning how boats move downhill and playing with the diggers.





Primary Science



In Primary Science we have been learning all about light. Finley learned about reflections using mirrors. It was very difficult to follow patterns using a mirror. We kept going the wrong way as everything was opposite. After a few trials we were able to understand that we had to draw everything backwards!



Speak Up Project - Enrichment

During enrichment, some of our pupils are taking part in the Speak Up project run by The National Theatre. The project aims to encourage young people to use their voices to gain confidence and discuss things which matter to them. The project started with some warm-up confidence building games and a discussion about what 'Be kind, be yourself, be bold' meant to pupils. In recent weeks pupils have played games that required focus, they had to see how many times they could pass the ball around the group without dropping it. They then worked together to co-create a beautiful mural which will be displayed in school.



Environmental Awareness

As part of ASDAN, Molly, Plamen and Ryan have been learning about 'Environmental Awareness', particularly the three Rs (recycle, reuse and reduce) and wanted to play a role in improving the environment. They are encouraging staff and pupils to put unwanted cardboard, paper etc in the recycle boxes that they have placed in all the classrooms. On a weekly basis the pupils will ensure that this waste is sent for re-cycling. Along with Mrs Taylor-Bunting, they visited a local re-cycle centre to witness re-cycling on a larger scale.



Art, Craft and Design

Recently our Y9 and Y10 Art, Craft and Design pupils visited Doncaster City centre. They had the opportunity to have a sneak preview of the latest exhibition 'The Florish' at The Point. Artwork was just being hung in preparation for this exhibition and we were extremely lucky to see all the work before it opened to the general public. We highly recommend you visit.

At the second gallery, pupils met with professional artist Julie H Winter. Julie showed pupils some of her amazing ARTBOMB work. She had created some wonderful imagery around LGBT and Doncaster Pride. The pupils loved looking at the vibrant colours and learned all about how she was inspired to create her project.

The pupils had a fantastic day and were inspired to start thinking about their own creative processes.



PSHE

MAKING MUSIC

Music teacher, Lucy Sheppard, came to work with some of our pupils to experience creating music using boomwhackers. All of the sizes made different sounds - the longer they were, the deeper the pitch and the shorter they were, the higher the pitch. We used them to follow along with different rhythms then had a go at creating our own composition of 8 beats. It was very difficult, but the staff were all extremely impressed with the sound produced.



SIGN CHOIR

On Tuesday lunchtimes, some pupils and staff get together to join in our Sign Choir. They have been learning 3 Christmas songs to perform with our primary pupils at Lakeside Village later this term in conjunction with Plover Primary School and are looking forward to learning other songs in January. Keira and Molly have worked so hard to learn to lead each song to support the primary pupils, using the staff to help them keep time.


Families and Relationships
