We won 1st prize! Nieve was our top scorer and Isabel won a medal for the top 'Hot Shot'. Amazing teamwork.












Surprise visit from Miss Croggon

Both A Jay and Finley were presented with their awards for being helpful and polite to staff and their peers.



Tour of Cast Theatre

A group of Year 8 and Year 9 pupils went to visit our local theatre, CAST in Doncaster recently to learn about careers in a working theatre. Pupils met interesting staff from a wide range of jobs in the theatre, quizzing them about what they do. They also had a tour around the backstage areas of the theatre, learning about how the lighting is set up and changed high above their second space stage, visited the actors changing and costume areas and got to go onto the main stage and learn all about how the sound is controlled – they felt the rumble of the huge speakers hidden in the stage walls and saw the sound control desk which costs more than an expensive car!

Pupils got to see how much work and skill goes into running the theatre and had plenty of opportunity to ask questions about how it all worked and what the staff there enjoyed or found challenging.





Enrichment

Recently, in Enrichment, pupils were visited by four members of 'Good News for Everyone' (formerly The Gideons UK). They very kindly gifted our pupils with either a Bible or an activity book to take home and keep. They showed pupils a video telling the story of Gladys Aylward who helped many children in China in the 1930's. Pupils then had chance to ask questions. 




Black History Month
