Careers

Secondary pupils enjoyed a tour of Nuffield Health Doncaster Fitness and Wellbeing Gym. They met with a variety of staff members and gained an insight into some of the job roles within the company and learned about individual career paths, qualifications gained etc. The duty manager explained her progression within the company, originally working in the café, then the gym's reception before training to management level despite struggling with dyslexia.

A retired dental surgeon spoke to pupils about his experiences at university and the procedures he carried out as a surgeon and emphasised the importance of resilience and how you must persevere with things, despite them being hard.

Pupils enjoyed their time with a gym instructor who explained how he had found his passion for fitness after enrolling at a gym and losing 9 stone in weight. This led to his desire to train and qualify as an instructor himself.

It was a very informative and worthwhile visit.











ASDAN

As part of the ASDAN unit, 'Environmental Awareness' Lacey, Igor and Christine have been learning how to re-use materials carefully and sensibly, so they do not go to waste. Pupils were encouraged to take reusable bags when out shopping.
